- 2. Consider requirements for use of SSE to initiate a Wellbeing promotion review
 - 3. Take stock of the effectiveness of our SSE process to date

Action Plan for SSE this year...

<u>The new school app</u> has been introduced and all staff are being encouraged to engage with its use. Parents and students are being encouraged to default to the new app for most if not all general communication with the school. Teachers are being asked to use the app camera function to ensure GDPR compliance and to spread information about school activities.

<u>The new school journal</u> contains several copies of the "topsheet" which was successfully trialled last year to enhance student engagement with feedback. All teachers are being encouraged to use these self-reflection aides at Halloween, Christmas and Easter. Progress and feedback from the use of the journal topsheets will inform our approach to this aspect of SSE into next year.

In "Identifying and Reflecting" on covid impact we have additionally involved students participation in the process. The updated LAOS objective is to involve student participation rather than just student voice. To this end we have undertaken a class based collaborative venture centered on the RE teachers. Students will be divided into 4 groups to reflect on the impact of covid on their <u>educational experiences and outcomes</u>, their <u>wellbeing</u>, their <u>motivation to learn</u>, and their <u>engagement in learning</u>. The RE teachers will collate responses and these will inform the whole school analysis.

As part of our Wellbeing review this year we will be asking students, parents and teachers to take part in surveys which it is hoped will be returned before Christmas. This will allow time to analyse the results and address issues which may arise. A particular focus this year will be students perceptions of negative educational effects due to the Covid lockdown experience.

The review of SSE to date will involve the SSE team in assessing the extent to which past initiatives have become embedded in the school.
